## **Mental Health Matters**

### You are not alone...

There are an estimated 5 million veterans in the UK, and a further 20,000 personnel leave the forces each year. When staff leave HM Forces, their healthcare transfers from the military to the NHS. Only around 0.1% of regular service personnel are discharged annually for mental health reasons. However some veterans develop mental health problems after leaving service, many of whom will be experiencing PTSD.

Until recently, little was known about these veterans. What is known is that only half of those experiencing mental health problems sought help from the NHS, and those that did were rarely referred to specialist mental health services.

Veterans' mental health problems may be made worse or caused by post-service factors, such as the difficulty in making the transition to civilian life, marital problems, and loss of family and social support networks. Younger veterans are at high risk of suicide in the first two years after leaving service. Ex-service personnel are also vulnerable to social exclusion and homelessness, both of which are risk factors for mental ill health. Alcohol misuse is also high.

A number of UK studies have found links between active service and mental health problems in armed service personnel involved in recent conflicts. A very recent study of 10,000 serving personnel (83% regulars; 27% reservists) found lower than expected levels of PTSD. Common mental disorders and alcohol misuse were the most frequently reported mental health problems among UK armed forces personnel. In particular, levels of alcohol misuse overall were substantially higher than in the general population.

A mental health condition can sometimes be incredibly difficult to detect and can often go unnoticed or untreated. It is vital that are service personnel and veterans are offered the help, support and guidance that they deserve and that no family is left grieving for the sudden loss of a loved one.

In recent weeks we have learnt of the sad news of the passing of two of our fellow Riflemen, Lance Corporal Any Francis and Colour Serjeant Matthew Pascoe.

Lance Corporal Andy Francis sadly passed away on Sunday 23 May 2021 followed by Colour Serjeant Matthew Pascoe on Tuesday 25 May 2021.

The funeral of CSjt Matthew Pascoe is to be held on the 15th of June at 12pm. The service will be held at Torquay Athletic Rugby Football Club.

The funeral of of LCpl Andy Francis is to be held on the 16th of June at 12:15pm. The service will be held at Mansfield Crematorium and will be available to view online via live feed.

Dear Fellow Riflemen,

The recent deaths of Colour Serjeant Matt Pascoe and Lance Corporal Andy Francis have touched us all. The Regiment's sympathies are especially extended to their families, friends and those with which they served so brilliantly. Tragically Matt and Andy are not the first Riflemen we have lost in this manner and despite all that the Army and Regiment have now been doing for some time I fear they will not be the last.

We have been acutely aware that some Riflemen need help: from the Army, NHS and Regiment but most of all from each other. That's why I recorded the 'time to talk' video – to spread the message that all of us, from the most senior to the most junior, have periods of suffering from mental ill-health and that the best possible solution is to talk and ask for help from family and friends.

For many years now The Rifles has been able to assist those in need who have reached out for help. Last year the Army introduced a wide-ranging mental resilience initiative for serving soldiers within the battalions (and wider Army). The NHS has a bespoke veterans treatment plan specifically for veterans. Despite this range of systemic support, we are tragically still losing our fellow Riflemen.

We know the system must play its part. But it can't be everywhere and do everything – we can fill some of those gaps. So I make a personal plea to every Rifleman and their friends. We know that it is those closest to people in need who stand the best chance of recognising when somebody needs help – battle partners as Riflemen were taught in training. A system cannot replace or replicate this. We must swiftly look after each other, call for help as soon as a worry occurs, and boldly dismiss any sense of such care being viewed as an over-reaction. It is a duty that we owe to each other and something that must become deeply embedded in our regimental culture. Should you have the slightest concern about yourself or a comrade, I urge serving Riflemen to alert their chain of command and our veterans to contact the appropriate agencies and/or our Regimental Headquarters so that everyone can be helped or sign-posted to where that help can be found.

I am certain that it is only through our collective care for each other within our regimental family that we will improve a situation that clearly demands all of our attention. Please reflect - who are you worried about? Please check up on them and ask for help if you have the slightest concern. That is the brave and right thing to do and I will be talking again to our Commanding Officers and Council about this very shortly in the hope that we can take our caring culture to the next level it demands. We owe this to our fallen and their families and must all help each other.

I mourn Matt Pascoe and Andy Francis, as I know you do. Two great Riflemen have gone. Rest in Peace.
